


Congratulations to the elected board members for the upcoming 2014-15 year you are all very deserving and will make the league proud.





Recipe from Adobe Oven Cookbook

Pineapple-Apricot Salad

2 packages orange gelatin

2 cups boiling water 1 cup pineapple juice

1 cup apricot juice

i cup apricoi juice

1 large can pineapple chunks

1 large can apricots

10 cut marshmallows

Topping:

½ cup pineapple juice ½ cup apricot juice

1

1 cup sugar

2 tablespoons flour (heaping)

1 beaten egg

2 tablespoons margarine

1 cup whipped cream

Lettuce leaves

Drain juice from fruit and reserve this. Dissolve gelatin in water and fruit juices. Add other ingredients and let set. Use 9 x 13 pan. Combine topping and cook until thick; then cool. Fold in 1 cup whipped cream. Spread on gelatin. Chill. Cut in squares when firm; serve on lettuce leaves.
