Membership committee has enjoyed creating and implementing this new series of mini-socials this year, and we look forward to continuing our *Ladies Who...* series next League year. This


series was created with recruitment in mind, and we were excited to see such a great turnout at our first mixed social.

# Recipe from Adobe Oven Cookbook Baked Artichoke Hearts

1 can artichoke hearts Melba toast rounds, rye or white 1/4 pound melted butter Salt Freshly ground pepper
Garlic powder to taster
(about 1/4 teaspoon)
Slivered almonds or sesame seeds

Drain artichokes and cut in half with shears. Place each half, cut side up, on a Melba round. Arrange on oven-proof dish on which they can be served. Melt butter and add salt, pepper and garlic powder. Spoon generously over artichokes. Sprinkle with almonds or sesame seeds and bake at 350 degrees for 10 minutes.
