

Recipe from Adobe Oven Cookbook

Party Hamburgers

l b hamburger
 cup soft bread crumbs
 ½ tablespoons catsup
 egg, slightly beaten
 4 teaspoon salt

2/3 cup coarsely grated Cheddar cheese
2 ¹/₂ tablespoons chopped green bell pepper
1 tablespoon chopped onion
¹/₄ cup bottled lemon juice
8 strips of bacon

Mix all ingredients together except lemon juice and bacon. Let stand 10 minutes to stiffen. Add bottled lemon juice and mix well. Divide into 8 patties and wrap a strip of bacon and secure with a toothpick. Broil either inside or on a charcoal outside. Serves 8.
