I had the great pleasure of interviewing Sustainer Kay Bartecchi. Her Junior League story begins in the 1970's when Kay and her husband Carl were looking for a home here in pueblo. To help with the closing of a home she sought out the help from attorney David Shaw. Two years later, Virginia Shaw sponsored Kay as a new member of the league. At that time, only 100 women were allowed to participate at a time. Once a member of Junior League, she was involved with the infant toddler center, looking up the regulations for the center to follow. Kay was part of the sales committee for the adobe cookbook. She was also involved with the day nursery, this all day program provided daycare options for the public. The day nursery board was in charge of the policies and procedures to manage the program.

Kay recalls, the day nursery having a terrible fire and the board pulling together to come up with a solution on how to restore the nursery.

Kay believes the biggest way Junior League has enriched her life is through the friendships she has made. How much she has learned through the committees and workshops put on by Junior League has opened up many more possibilities to serving pueblo, like volunteering for united way. Kay hopes to see the league continue. I know you are all busy, but "there is just so much to learn from the league".

Originally from Detroit, Michigan Kay went to university of Michigan and studied physical therapy. She worked for three years before she married. She took a break from working for 10 years to raise her 3 children before going back to work here in pueblo. Kay knew from the young age of 13 that she wanted to be a physical therapist. I was impressed she knew what her dream was so early on in life and she set a goal to accomplish it.

Today Kay spends her days visiting family, she has a total of 5 grandchildren and travels to Avon and Fort Collins, Colorado and Fairbanks, Alaska to visit them. She enjoys reading, walking, and playing words with friends. She sits on the board for the chamberlain foundation advisory board and in the past served on the Packard foundation advisory board. Another way she and her husband spend time is traveling. Her husband was a flight surgeon in the military and served in Vietnam during the Vietnam War helping wounded soldiers. He later was stationed in Colorado Springs and fell in love with the state of Colorado and vowed to move back. He never forgot the beauty of Vietnam and wanted to share the wonder with Kay. They both felt how welcoming the people of Vietnam were and they travel there often. The city of Hanoi has a program to conduct educational programs for the doctors. "I like how the people of Vietnam look to the future and how warm and welcoming they are. And, as a bonus, the beach resorts are wonderful!"

Recipe from Adobe Oven Cookbook **Spinach Salad**

6 cloves garlic, quartered
3/4 cup French dressing (not creamy)
3 hard-cooked eggs, chopped

8 bacon slices,fried and crumbled1/2 pound cleaned spinach

Marinate garlic in French dressing several hours. At serving time, sprinkle eggs and bacon over spinach which has been torn up. Remove garlic from dressing and pour over salad. Salt and pepper to taste. Toss and serve at once. Serves: 6
