

Dorothy has retired from Pueblo School District #60 in 2009, having served as a media specialist for 24 years. One of her most unusual experiences came in the summer of 2000 when she traveled on a Chevron/Texaco oil tanker as a 'supernumerary' – a part of an ongoing classroom project.

Dorothy was introduced to Junior League in 1980 by her friend, Kay Bartecchi. According to Dorothy, "Back then, we were organizing the Pueblo Infant Toddler Center and did the Own Your Own Art Show. I was impressed with the teamwork shared by league members, the high standards they sought and their personal commitment to league projects. ## Recipe from Adobe Oven Cookbook

### Viva La Chicken

4 chicken breasts

1 dozen corn tortillas

1 can cream of mushroom soup

1 can cream of chicken soup

1 cup milk

1 onion, grated

1 can Ortega green chili salsa

1 pound Cheddar cheese, grated

Bake chicken in foil, bone and cut in large pieces. Cut tortillas into one inch strips. Mix soups, milk, onion and chili salsa. Butter baking dish. Place layer of tortillas, layer of chicken, layer of soups and repeat, ending with liquid on top. Top with cheese. Let stand in refrigerator for 24 hours. Bake at 300 degrees for 1-11/2 hours or until bubbly. Serves 6. - Estella McKittrick
