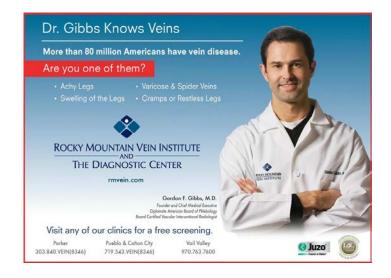
Funds Committee Report

Barbara, or "Barb," as her friends call her, was born in Bellingham, Washington, population 35,000, where she graduated high school. Barb was the senior class representative and learned then that she had a passion for working with others to improve community conditions. Barbara has been married for 46 years to William, and they have three children and four grandchildren.

Barb graduated from CSU-Ft Collins with a BS degree in Speech and Hearing Therapy and she and William moved to Pueblo in 1971. Barb immediately took an interest in the family business; she worked at Vidmar Motor Co for thirty years and was the dealer of record for most of that time. During that time, she attended General Motors Institute in Flint, MI and took every class in dealership management they had to offer, since she had no formal business background. It was during this time that Barb joined Junior League. According to Barb, "I joined Junior League soon after we re-located to Pueblo in order to get involved with the community and to meet other caring, dynamic women."

Barb was an active member of Junior League for almost thirteen years; she joined when her youngest child was less than a month old; and she "retired" (as per the rules of the time) at age 40. Barb still feels that the friendships she developed through Junior League are still important to her life today. "I enjoyed assessing needs within our community, problem-solving, working together and realizing the synergy of our collective talents." Just one of the many community impact events Barb was a part of helped to raise the money to start and expand the hanging pots downtown and on HARP; today, Barb remains an integral member of a small group of dedicated women who fill all the pots with soil and plants (over 50 per pot).

Barb's professional memberships, volunteerism, and community involvement creates an impressive resume that includes service on the Pueblo City Council, work as the Pueblo Urban Renewal Authority Commissioner, Rotary, numerous state and national boards, and much, much more. Today, Barb enjoys gardening, hiking, reading, and photography.

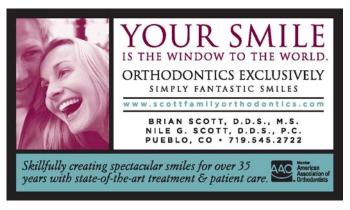


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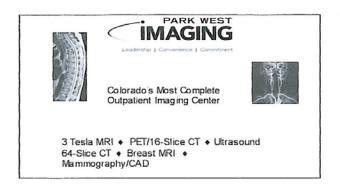

Recipe from Adobe Oven Cookbook

Green Bean Casserole

2 packages frozen French cut green beans

1 can soy beans, well drained*

1 cup grated Cheddar cheese

 $1\ can\ water\ chestnuts,\ chopped$

1 can cream of mushroom soup

1 package frozen French fried onion rings

Season to taste

Partly cook beans and drain well; mix with all other ingredients except onion rings. (Mixture will be dry). Arrange onion rings over top and bake at 350 degrees for about 45 minutes. May be prepared for baking a day ahead if desired.

*If soy beans are not available, omit them and water chestnuts and substitute ¾ to 1 cup toasted, slivered almonds.
