Recipe from Adobe Oven Cookbook

#### **Hot Spicy Cider**

1 1/2 quarts apple cider1 teaspoon whole cloves1 teaspoon whole allspice

2 sticks cinnamon, about 3" long 2 tablespoons red hots (optional)

Combine Cider, cloves allspice, and cinnamon sticks in large bowl or large Pyrex dish. Microwave until warm (4 to 5 minutes). Let stand 15 minutes. Strain into cups or punch bowl.
