The JL Cookbook Committee worked hard this summer planning and organizing Junior Leagues First Annual Touch-A-Truck event with the partnership of the Pueblo Convention Center and boy was it a huge hit!! The free event held on August 17, 2014 at the Pueblo Convention Center is an event the public is still raving about. We had 903 people of all ages walk through the gates that day making a large impact on the community, what Junior League stands for. We were very grateful to receive 300 books (roughly equal to \$1,000) from the Kiwanis to be donated that day. Children who visited the booth received a free book or they received a gift card to Barnes and Noble to pick a book of their choice. For our first year we were hoping to break even, but to a surprise we made a small dent towards our cookbook savings goal of \$583.07!! Thank you to the committee for all your hard work to put together such a smashing event in such a small amount of time and thank you to all those that came out to volunteer and support the amazing day!

The Funds Committee is hard at work already as they plan Junior League's Second Annual Monster Dash 5k Race. The event will take place on Saturday, October 18, 2014, so mark your calendars now as we will need help to make the day a success! 


