



Heather Arellano



working with other mothers and professional women in helping the children of Pueblo.




Heather Nightlinger




Ashley Osterhout

I spend the rest of my spare time shopping, of course!








Desiree Skyba





Recipe from Adobe Oven Cookbook

Crows Nest Surprise

1 can Fruit cocktail (number 303 size)	1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup sugar	1 egg
1 1/2 cups flour	1/2 cup brown sugar
1 teaspoon soda	1/2 cup chopped pecans

Mix together the fruit cocktail, sugar, flour, soda, salt and egg. Pour into greases and floured 9 by 13 1/2—inch pan. Spread brown sugar and pecans over top. Bake for 25 minutes at 350 degrees, reduce heat to 310 degrees and bake for 15 minutes longer. Serve with whipped cream or ice cream.
