
Funds Committee Report





Recipe from Adobe Oven Cookbook

Pumpkin Cookies

1 cup butter or shortening 1 cup sugar Icing: 1 cup pumpkin 1 egg ½ cup brown sugar 1 teaspoon vanilla 2 cups flour 1/4 cup milk 1 teaspoon baking powder 1 teaspoon soda 3 tablespoons butter 1 teaspoon cinnamon ½ teaspoon salt 34 teaspoon vanilla ½ cup dates or raisins (optional) ½ cup nuts (optional) 1 cup confectioners' sugar

Work butter until creamy. Gradually blend in sugar until smooth. Add pumpkin, egg and vanilla and mix well. Sift dry ingredients together and add in raisins and dates or nuts if desired. Drop by teaspoon onto cookie sheet and bake for 10 to 15 minutes at 375 degrees, or until golden brown. Cool on rack.

To prepare icing, combine brown sugar, milk and butter in saucepan and cook for two minutes. Remove from heat and stir in vanilla and confectioners' sugar to spreading consistency.
