


Kryste Brown

Recipe from Adobe Oven Cookbook

Pineapple Lady Finger Frozen Dessert

3 egg yolks
Dash salt
¹ / ₂ cup sugar
9-ounce can crushed pineapple
2 tablespoons lemon juice

3 egg whites 2 tablespoons sugar 1 cup whipping cream, whipped 2 cups lady fingers or vanilla wafers

Beat egg yolks, salt and sugar together; add juice from drained pineapple and the lemon juice; cook over hot water until mixture coats spoon. Add crushed pineapple and let mixture cool. Beat egg whites and sugar until stiff and fold into whipped cream; fold mixture into custard. Line pan with lady fingers (crumbs) and add custard. Top with sprinkling of crumbs. Freeze.
